Since the Islamic regime of Iran took power in 1979, people in Iran have been deprived from their basic rights including their freedom of expression. Soon after the regime established its power, mass imprisonment and execution of thousands of dissident started. Since 1979, no opposition has been tolerated, and slightest resistance to the establishment has been faced with fiercest punishment. This has been the living situation in Iran for more than 30 years, and since then, the numbers of political prisoners have been on the rise; hundreds of them are in danger of being execution.

The Campaign to Free Political Prisoners in Iran (CFPPI) would like to appeal for your support of those men and women, boys and girls, students and intellectuals who are currently being held in solitary confinement waiting for their daily dose of torture, and even their death sentence to be carried out.
